It was great to visit the Gym last week to see students really enjoying being back at school and playing ball and racket sports with their peers during PE lessons.

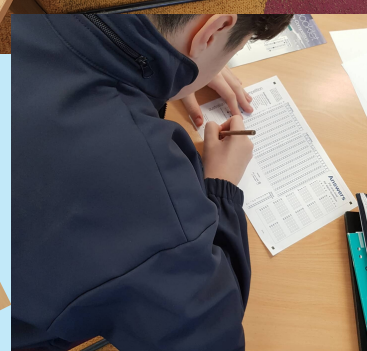
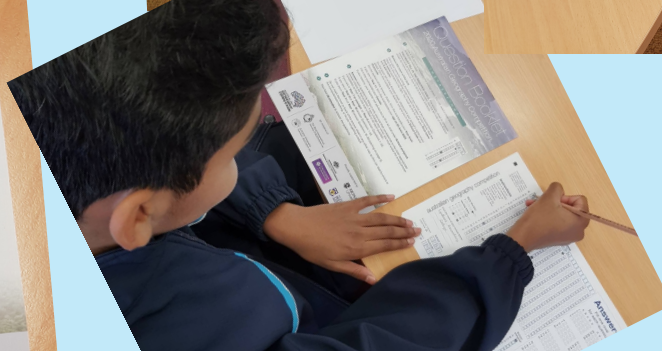
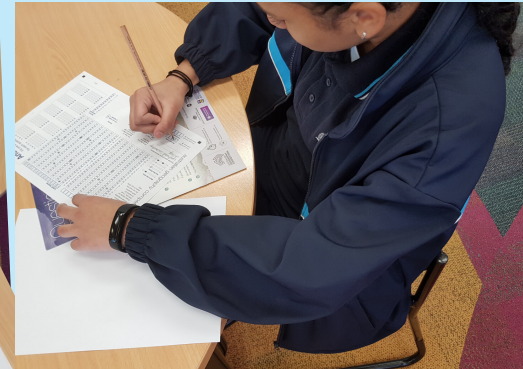
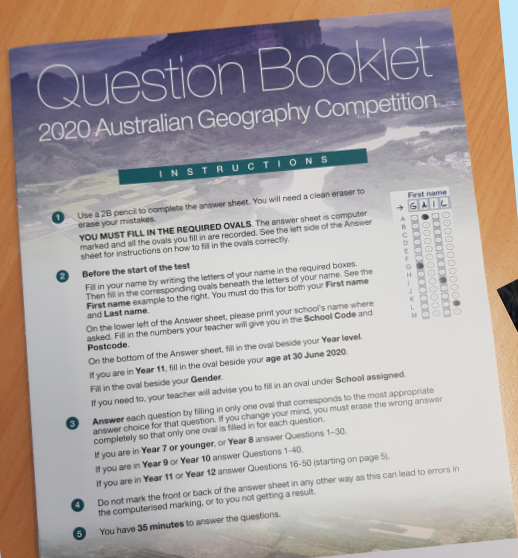


CRICKET VICTORIA GIRLS LEADERSHIP PROGRAM
