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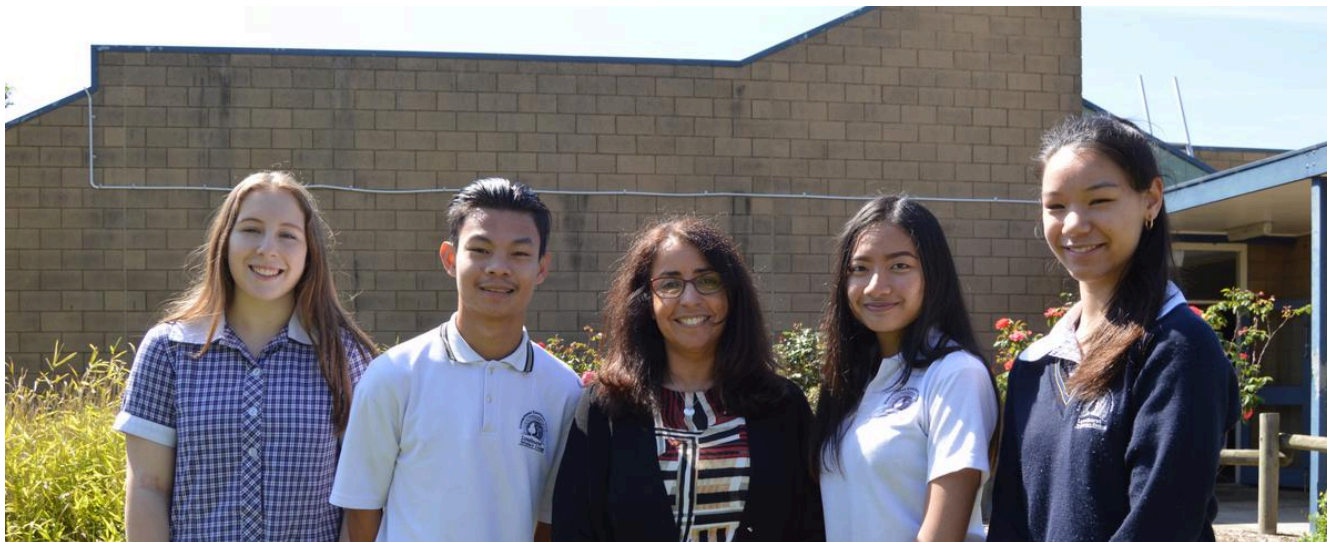

Year 11 VCAL students have been finishing off their Community activities. As part of this work they have received many donations from

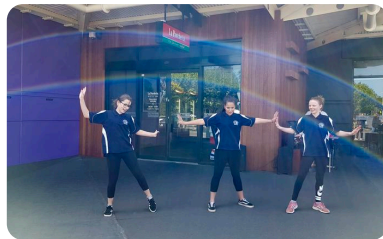

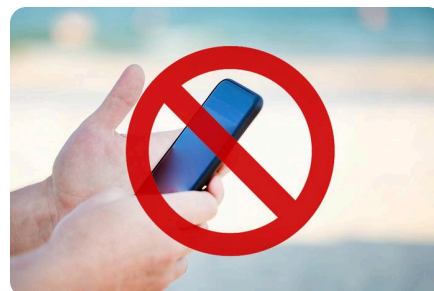
Mobile Phones

As you may be aware, the Victorian government has announced a new mobile phone policy that will require students to switch their phones off and securely store them away during the school day.

The policy is designed to support teaching and learning in an environment that is free from unnecessary distractions, disruptions and student inattention caused by the urge to check their phones. At recess and lunch times, students will be better-placed to communicate with each

other face to face and/or be involved in activities rather than being focused on a device or on social media.

The school is currently working on our own mobile phone policy



that will implement the Government's announcement in a way that reflects the needs of our own community. As such, we will be undertaking consultation with students, staff and families to ensure our approach to implementing this policy meets the needs of our whole community.

Details about consultations and the finalised policy for Lyndhurst Secondary College will be made available throughout Term 4.

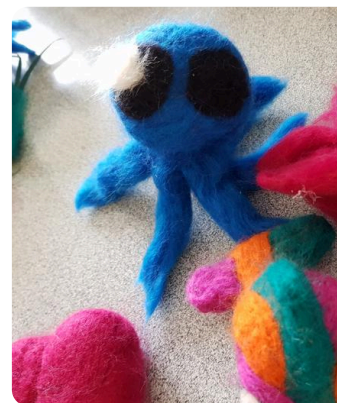

- When buying, be wary of items that seem very cheap. If it seems too good to be true, it probably is
- If you become a victim, notify police immediately

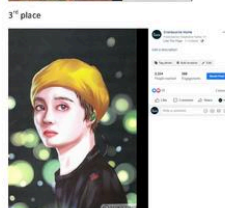
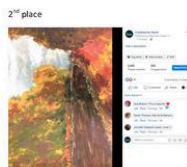
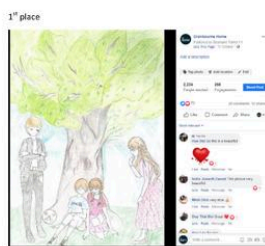
